

Supreme Court Panel Approves 5 Ganga Hydropower Projects



A Supreme Court panel has approved five hydropower projects on the Ganga in Uttarakhand, despite concerns from the Environment and Jal Shakti Ministries about landslides and ecological risks.

The cleared projects are:

- 1. Bowala Nandprayag (300 MW, Alaknanda River)
- 2. Devasri (252 MW, Pinder River)
- 3. Bhyundar Ganga (24.3 MW)
- 4. Jhalakoti (12.5 MW)
- 5. Urgam-II (7.5 MW)

Fifteen other projects were rejected due to high-risk zones or environmental impact. The government will finalize its decision in eight weeks.




Draft Plastic Treaty Criticized for Gaps

India's Q2 GDP Falls to 5.4%

India's real GDP slumped to a seven-quarter low of 5.4% in the July-September 2024 quarter The last quarter when growth was lower was the October-December quarter in 2022 (4.3%) 9.9 GDP (in %) Sept. 2021 June 2022 Dec. 2023 Sept. 2024

India's GDP growth dropped to 5.4% in Q2, marking a seven-quarter low, primarily due to weak corporate earnings and sluggish manufacturing. Agriculture and services grew, but mining contracted. Economists warn this threatens RBI's full-year growth target of 7.2%.

Core Industries See October Growth

India's core industries grew by 3.1% in October, driven by recovery in coal, cement, and steel sectors. This marks the best performance in three months, reflecting a slight industrial recovery.

Greenwashing is when companies, organizations, or countries make exaggerated, dubious, or false claims about their environmental or climate-friendly practices. This tactic aims to appear environmentally responsible while masking harmful actions.

Example: The 2015 Volkswagen scandal involved falsified emissions tests for diesel cars marketed as eco-friendly.

How it Affects the Carbon Market

- Greenwashing can undermine carbon trading mechanisms.
- Carbon credits represent emissions reduced or avoided.
 Entities often exaggerate efforts or use questionable methodologies to generate these credits, leading to reduced trust in the system.

Recent Developments:

India's Guidelines to Prevent Greenwashing

India's Consumer Affairs Ministry has issued guidelines to curb misleading environmental claims. Key points include:

- 1. Misleading terms like "eco-friendly" or "natural" are allowed only if substantiated with evidence.
- 2. Technical jargon like "ecological footprint" must be explained clearly for consumer understanding.
- 3. Advertisers, manufacturers, and endorsers are subject to these rules.

Types of Greenwashing

- 1. Greenhushing: Withholding information about sustainability efforts.
- 2. Green-crowding: Hiding unsustainable practices in a group.
- 3. Greenshifting: Shifting responsibility for sustainability to consumers.
- 4. Greenlighting: Highlighting one sustainable initiative to distract from harmful activities.
- 5. Greenlabelling: Misleading claims about product sustainability.

BEYOND THE NUGGET:

Understanding Carbon Credit Trading

- How it Works: Industrial units outperforming emission standards earn credits; those falling short can buy these credits to meet regulations.
- Value: One carbon credit equals one tonne of CO₂ (or equivalent greenhouse gases) reduced or avoided.
- Concerns: The process is often questioned for greenwashing due to unverifiable claims about emission reductions.

By addressing greenwashing, the guidelines aim to ensure accountability, build trust in carbon markets, and encourage genuine sustainability efforts.

For the first time, scientists have captured a detailed image of WOH G64, a red supergiant star in the Large Magellanic Cloud, 160,000 light-years away. Using the Very Large Telescope Interferometer in Chile, they revealed the star's egg-shaped cocoon and signs of its imminent death. WOH G64, 2,000 times the Sun's size, is shedding layers and may collapse into a black hole or explode as a supernova.
