


Logjam ends, Parliament to debate Constitution

Dry regions like South Asia, Africa, and the Mediterranean.

Home Price Index Rises by 4.3% Amid High Rates: RBI

The RBI's Home Price Index rose 4.34% YoY in September 2024, reflecting strong housing demand despite high rates. Bengaluru saw the highest growth (+8.76%), while Kanpur declined (-2%). Prices rose across major cities, with Delhi NCR leading a 32% annual increase. Unsold inventory dropped for the third quarter, signaling positive buyer sentiment.



Why in News?

 The government recently announced the soft launch of Nafithromycin, providing hope against community-acquired bacterial pneumonia (CABP), a global health concern causing over two million deaths annually.

Key Highlights:

1. Purpose:

• Treats CABP, particularly in vulnerable populations like children, the elderly, and immunocompromised patients. India bears 23% of global pneumonia cases.

2. Potency:

- 10x more effective than Azithromycin.
- Short, 3-day regimen validated by trials.

3. Development:

- · Supported by BIRAC under the Department of Biotechnology.
- First antibiotic in its class globally in 30+ years.

4. Safety:

• Minimal side effects, food tolerance, and no drug interactions.

Understanding Pneumonia:

- · Infects lung alveoli, causing difficulty breathing and oxygen intake.
- Types: Bacterial, Viral, Aspiration, and Fungal.
- Walking Pneumonia: Milder infection caused by atypical bacteria.

Tackling AMR

- AMR makes infections harder to treat and caused 4.95 million deaths globally in 2019.
- India's National Programme on AMR Containment and National Action Plan (2017) focus on surveillance, infection control, and antimicrobial stewardship.

Nafithromycin marks a major leap in India's fight against AMR and showcases its growing biotech capabilities, providing an effective solution to a critical global health challenge.
